

Patient Information Leaflet - Emergency Prescriptions

The following are considered to be emergency medications, without which the patient could suffer significant harm within two working days.

Missing doses of these medications may compromise their efficacy, or cause significant harm for the patient.

- Salbutamol / Ventolin reliever spray, Terbutaline/bricanyl
- GTN spray – Glyceryl trinitrate
- Medications for an arrhythmia - Verapamil / Diltiazem / Amiodarone / Bisoprolol, Propranolol / Atenolol
- Oral nitrates – Isosorbide Mononitrate (ISMN)
- Insulin
- Adrenaline pen - EpiPen
- Contraceptive pills (28 days supply will be provided)
- Oral steroids (Prednisolone / Dexamethasone) if used as a daily, long term medication
- Palliative care patient medications
- Lithium / antipsychotics – Olanzapine, Risperidone
- Methotrexate / DMARDs - hydroxychloroquine
- Warfarin / NOAC – Rivaroxaban / Apixaban
- Parkinson's disease medications
- Anti-epileptics – Phenytoin / Sodium Valproate / Levetiracetam
- Specialised baby milks
